Taking the plunge for GMDVP

There are plenty of polar bear clubs across the country that get their kicks diving into ice cold water in the dead of winter. Yet few self-styled polar bears have looked as fabulous as Gay Men's Domestic Violence Project (GMDVP) executive director Curt Rogers, who dove into the cold waters of Carson Beach in South Boston Feb. 11 while wearing a stylish silver frock. Nine other intrepid swimmers joined Rogers, including one person dressed as Patrick from Spongebob Squarepants and another as one of the Aqua Teen Hunger Force Mooninites that terrorized Boston this month. Those brave swimmers were taking part in GMDVP's third annual Winter Plunge, a fundraiser that has grown from having three participants the first year to 10 this year. Pledges from the event are still being totaled, but GMDVP estimates the event raised between \$5000 and \$10,000 for the organization.
